### **CLASS INFORMATION**

**All classes meet TUESDAY through FRIDAY unless otherwise indicated.** See schedule for dates and times.

**Preschool-kindergarten classes** are for kids ages 4 to 6, including those who have just completed kindergarten. Classes meet for one hour daily.

**Elementary classes** are for kids who have just completed 1st through 5th grades. Classes meet for 2 or 2½ hours daily.

**Middle School classes** are for students who have just completed 6th through 8th grades. Classes meet for 2 hours daily.

**Adult classes** are offered to those who have completed at least one year of high school.

**To provide safe, age-appropriate activities, NO EXCEPTIONS** will be made to the grade and age designations above. Class sizes are limited in order to provide high-quality art experiences.
